BORDER POLICE DEPARTMENT KÖLCSE

From the provisions of the Nagyhódos Road Border Crossing Point regarding passengers

The border crossing regulations define the mandatory requirements that both the inspection bodies and passengers must comply with in order to ensure the safe and rapid conduct of border control.

The regulations of the crossing point regarding passengers are as follows:

The area of the crossing point: The area of the crossing point is a closed system, on the section of route 41133 leading to the crossing point, from the sign reading "Nagyhódos border crossing point" in front of the designated crossing point to the sign marking the end of the border crossing point.

Border traffic control: In the area of the crossing, passengers are checked and allowed to pass through in the order of arrival, in exiting and entering traffic according to the direction of traffic, one lane at a time, within the framework of the so-called one-stop check system.

The use of the border crossing point covers:

- a) Citizens of the Member States of the European Union, citizens of other states party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area, and citizens of the Swiss Confederation,
- b) Family members of the persons referred to in point a) who are third-country nationals and beneficiaries of the provisions of Union law on the free movement of citizens of the European Union,
- c) Citizens of Ukraine, as well as
- d) Family members of the persons specified in point c) who are third-country nationals for passenger traffic (except bus traffic).

The border crossing is open every day with limited opening hours, from 07:00 to 18:00, for 11 hours a day.

The use of the road border crossing point covers passenger traffic, excluding goods traffic. At the border crossing point, passenger traffic can cross on foot, by bicycle, motorcycle, passenger car, passenger minibuses, and trucks up to a total weight of 3,500 kg, excluding the transport of goods.

Passengers traveling by car may enter and exit in lanes 1-1. After entering and exiting in front of the checkpoint in the crossing area, they may change their lanes only upon instruction or with permission, in compliance with traffic rules.

Passengers traveling by vehicle are required to stop their vehicle at the checkpoint (as indicated by the police officer), and pedestrians and cyclists are also checked in these lanes, as there is no separate traffic lane available for them.

The order of passenger checks is as follows:

The general sequence of checks for both directions of traffic is:

- police passport check
- customs inspection

MANDATORY regulations for passengers: Passengers arriving at the border crossing point are obliged to hand over their travel documents and any documents requested by the police officer at the checkpoints and to cooperate with him during the inspection and stay at the checkpoint. When inspecting vehicles and shipments, the operator or the carrier, or in their absence the driver of the vehicle, is obliged to open the passenger, luggage and cargo compartments of the vehicle at the call of the police officer or financial officer, and to unload and load the items located there, and to open the packages. During the border control, the passport officer is also entitled to inspect other documents.

The vehicle engine must be turned off during the inspection. Passengers are obliged to comply with the instructions of the person conducting the inspection and to cooperate with the police officer or Customs administrator. The police officer assigned to the border control task is authorized to conduct an external inspection of vehicles (consignments) applying for crossing, to check the passenger compartment, luggage compartment, engine compartment and travel documents. Those traveling by vehicle are required to remain in the vehicle during the check, unless the police officer conducting the check provides otherwise in order to carry out the check.

It must be ensured that arriving vehicles reach the inspection line without stopping. After the completion of the police and customs inspection, passengers are required to leave the crossing area without stopping. Passengers are required to leave the crossing area after the inspections. Waiting, stopping, and thus disrupting traffic is **PROHIBITED**, both for pedestrians and motorists. While at the border crossing point, drivers of vehicles are required to comply with the provisions of the Road Traffic Act. The maximum speed of vehicles at the crossing point is 5 km/h.

According to the law that came into effect to protect non-smokers in the border crossing area smoking is only allowed in vehicles or in designated areas. Littering and the dumping or abandonment of environmentally hazardous materials is also **PROHIBITED** according to the Environmental Protection Act. The person causing the damage is financially liable for any damage caused to buildings, structures, or technical equipment, and the costs of their repair are borne by the person causing the damage.

Regulations and prohibitions for passengers:

- Littering in the crossing area is prohibited!
- It is prohibited to get out from the vehicle used for border crossing, without the direction or permission of the inspection authorities!
- It is prohibited to take photographs, film or record with any kind of device capable of recording images or sound in the border crossing area without permission!
- It is forbidden to leave the crossing area without permission from the inspection authorities!
- From the state border to the checkpoint, persons are required to proceed continuously; it is prohibited to wait on the road section leading from the state border to the border crossing point.
- It is prohibited to park or wait in the border crossing area, except for administrative purposes.

4. Consequences of violating the crossing rules:

The Police may impose sanctions against violators of the rules of the border crossing point, based on the provisions of Act II of 2012 on misdemeanours, if the police officer detects the violation. If the violation is detected by another authority operating in the border crossing area, it will take measures based on the applicable laws to stop the violation and they will report it to the police service commander.
